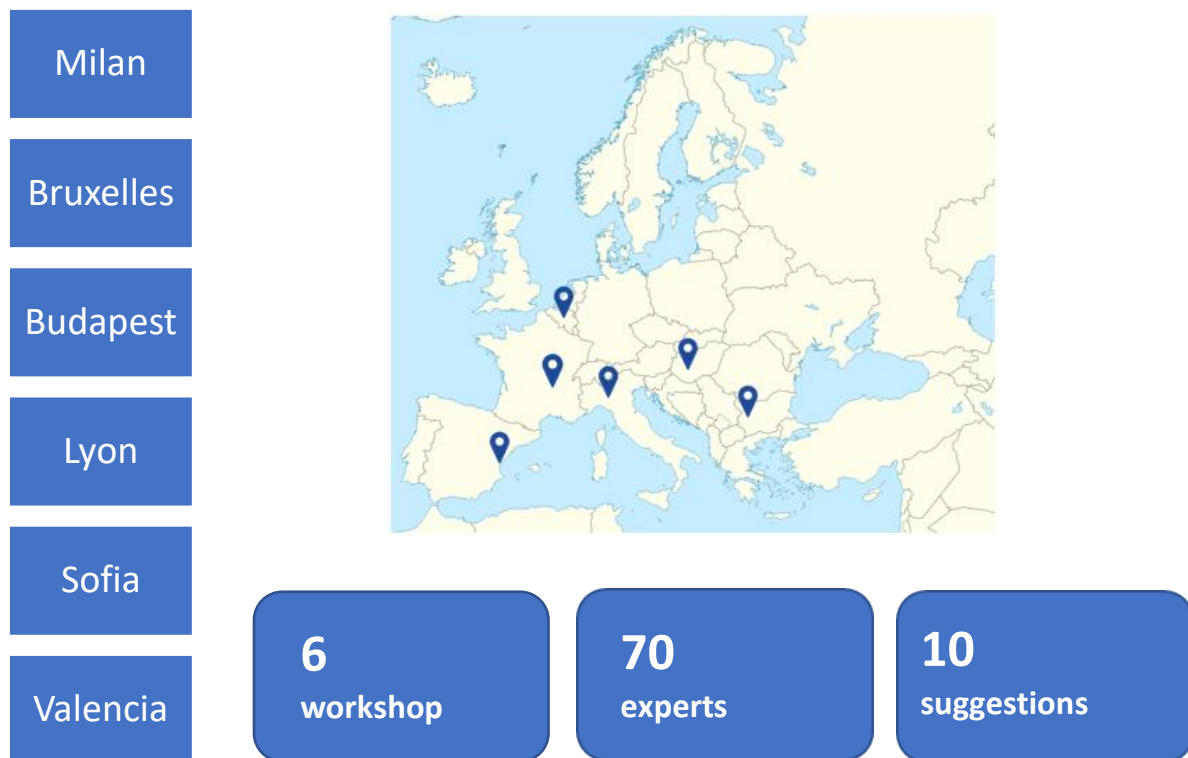

Each country involved in the project (Italy, Spain, France, Bulgaria, Hungary and Belgium) has submitted to a panel of stakeholders in the wood-furniture sector the professional curriculum of the Innovation Advisor developed in the previous months, to collect suggestions for improvement and deepen the role that this figure can have in the sector at national level.

More than 70 experts from the world of business, applied research, university and VET centres met to identify the key competences of the Innovation Advisor starting from the state of the art of the sector at national level.
